Numeracy basic skills – to complete frequently.

- Count forwards from 0 to 20.
- Count backwards from 20 to 0
- Number recognition to 20.
- Order numbers to 20.
- Find one more and one less than a given number.

Literacy basic skills – to complete frequently.

- Share your favourite stories.
- Practise sound recognition (red books)
- Practise reading words (yellow books)
- Practise writing your whole name.
- Letter formation
- Robot talk e.g. find the c-a-t (Cat) d-o-g (dog) h-a-t (hat)

Physical development

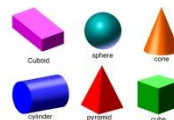
Football is a popular sport in England. Continuing from last week – practise ball skills.
