Numeracy basic skills – to complete frequently.

- Count forwards from 0 to 20.
- Count backwards from 20 to 0

Literacy basic skills – to complete frequently.

- Share your favourite stories.

Sort them – Can you identify similarities and differences? You could finish by making a fruit salad like we did at school when we read Oliver's Fruit Salad. Do you remember that story? Mathematics

Use your number line to add. Throw a dice and record the number, throw again and add it.

E.g. 6+3=

Start on 6 on your number line and then count on 6 more, what number are you on? 6+3=9

How to make a Paper Fan

Step 1 - Spread the paper out on a clean, flat work surface and plan your design. Traditional designs include birds with long, elegant feathers; cranes; koi fish; butterflies; weeping cherry trees; bonsai trees; and pagodas.

Step 2 - Draw a design. Colour in to make it bright..

Step 3 - Turn your paper so it's a long, vertical sheet. Fold up the last 1/2 inch of the paper. Flip the paper over and fold the folded edge of the paper up another 1/2 inch. Continue this way until the entire paper is folded into an accordion.

Step 4 - Push the folds of the accordion together so you have a thick rectangle of paper. Wrap the bottom 1/2 inch of the rectangle with tape.

Now you have a fan!

You can make it even better by;

Step 5 - If you have a stick (Any sort)

Glue the stick on either end of your paper accordion. Position one end of each stick right above the masking tape wrapped around the bottom of the paper accordion. The opposite end of each stick should stick out at least 1 inch beyond the untaped end of the paper. Allow the glue to dry overnight.

Step 6 - Open your fan by pulling the craft sticks away from each other. Fold the sticks downward toward the floor and press them together.
