Numeracy basic skills – to complete frequently.

- Count forwards from 0 to 20.
- Count backwards from 20 to 0
- Number recognition to 20.
- Order numbers to 20.
- Find one more and one less than a given number.
- Practical addition and subtraction

Literacy basic skills – to complete frequently.

- Share your favourite stories.
- Practise sound recognition (red books)
- Practise reading words (yellow books)
- Practise writing your whole name.
- Letter formation
- Robot talk e.g. find the c-a-t (Cat) d-o-g (dog) h-a-t (hat)

Practise singing your favourite nursery rhymes. Can you hear the rhyming words? What other words do you know that rhyme? Write your favourite nursery rhyme.

On your daily walk or using Google maps, look at your local environment. What can you see? Are all the houses the same? What plants can you see? Do you pass a shop? Can you notice any road signs? What is natural and what is man-made? Create a map of your local area.



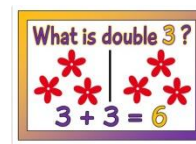
Mathematics

A number line was sent home. Use this to help you find one more and one less than a given number. E.g. One more than 8 is 9 (find 8 on your number line and add one on). One less than 8 is 7 (find 8 on your number line and jump back to take one away).



Mathematics

When we double, we 'add the same again'. Practise doubling objects to 10. Have a go at recording your answers. $1+1=2$ $2+2=4$ You could use: toys, sweets, fruit, pencils etc to help.



Physical development

Morris dancing is a traditional English dance. Watch some on YouTube and have a go! What is your favourite pop song? Can you make up your own routine to the song? Remember when we dance, we count to the beat of 8.
