Basic Skills Maths:

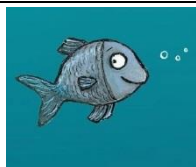
Continue to regularly practise:

- number bonds to 10 and 20.
- counting in steps of 10, 5 and 2.
- doubling numbers up to at least 20 (e.g. $2+2=4$, $3+3=6$ etc)
- halving different amounts (e.g. half of $6 = 3$)
- number formation 0 - 9

Use an online splat square to practise number recognition and counting forwards and backwards from any given number. Why not challenge a grown up to see how quickly they can splat the numbers you give them – how many can they get in 10 seconds?
