Watch the [video](#) to see what they look like. Now play the [game](#) matching the time to the correct clock.

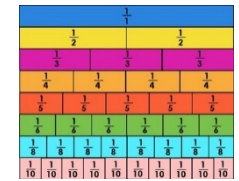


Make sure you tick the box, above the third clock, to turn the clock numbers to Roman numerals.
